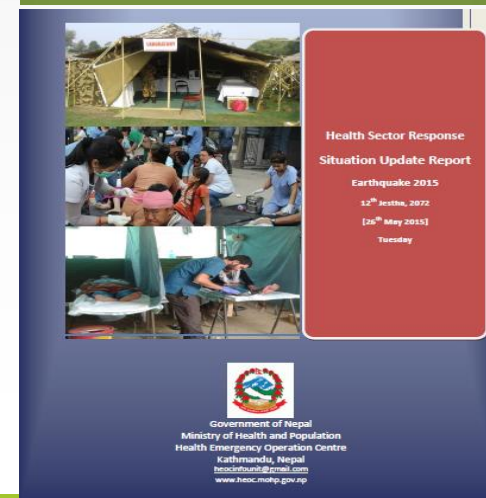
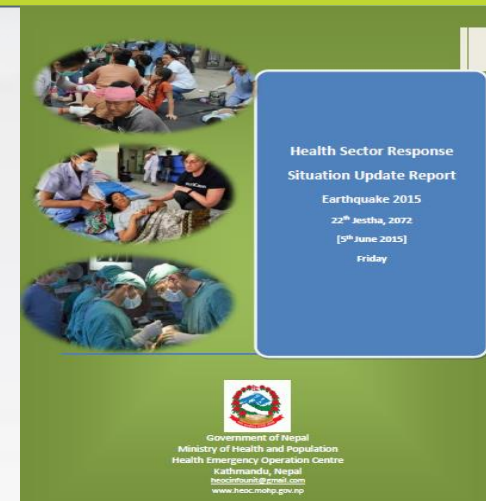
Immediate Need for Information

- What, Where, How much is damaged (of lives, injuries, households, health facilities...)
- Which facilities are intact/operational?
- What are the immediate needs?
- What is available?
- Who can provide what? How?



Health Sector Response: Situation Update Reports

- ❖ Information Management Unit at HEOC – 1st May
- ❖ Situation Update Report
 - Needs assessment of districts and facilities
 - Logistics and human resource management
 - Foreign medical teams (147; 37 countries)
 - National medical teams
- ❖ Hospital Based Syndromic Surveillance (108 sites)
- ❖ 1-25 May: Daily; 26 May onwards: Tuesday & Friday
- ❖ 09 June onwards: EWARS Weekly Bulletin EDCCD
- ❖ Information sharing: 100+ stakeholders
- ❖ **Effective response**

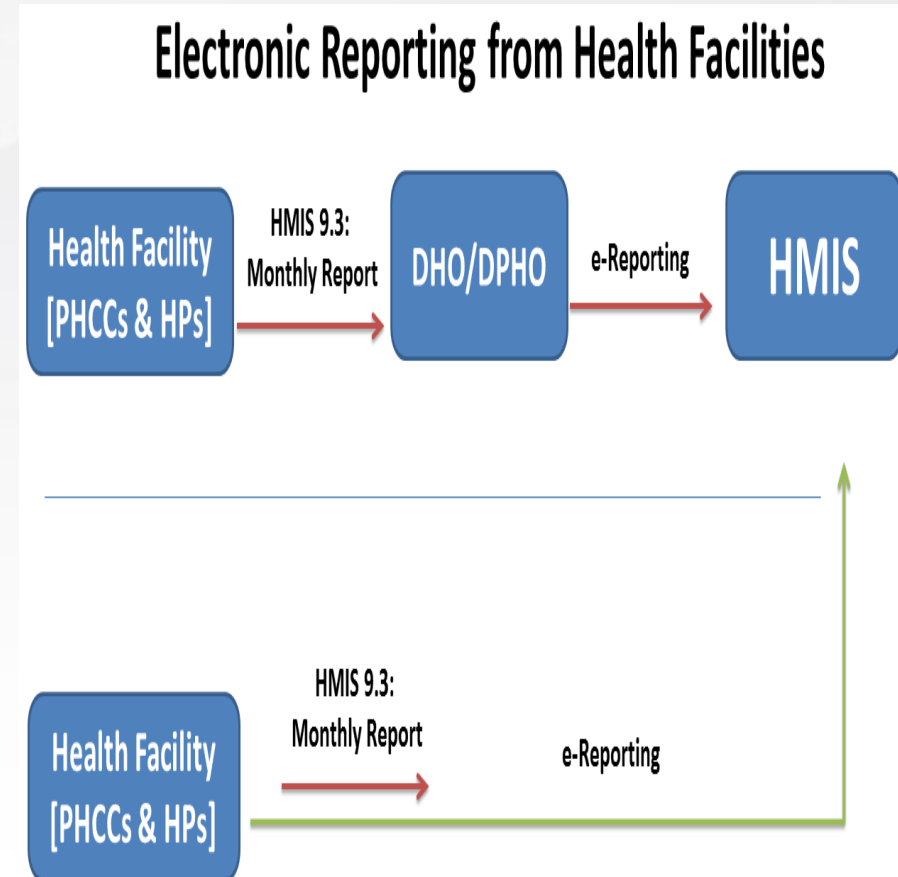
Electronic Reporting from Facilities

- Smart communication
- Promotes data use at local level
- Reduces data entry work load at district level
- Improves data quality
- Provides common platform for other MISs (LMIS, HIIS, TABUCS, HR)
- Stepping stone towards EHR
- An initiative to enhance **accountability, transparency and evidence-based decision making** by leveraging technology



Electronic Reporting from Facilities: Status and Way forward

- Dolakha (23) & Ramechhap (21) (NHSSP)
- Nuwakot, Dhading & Rasuwa (GiZ)
- Kanchanpur, Palpa, Kaski, Bhaktapur, Chitwan (WHO)
- Bardiya, Arghakhanchi, Jumla (USAID)
- NHSS RF & DLI: % of (*districts with all*) facilities electronically reporting using DHIS2
- All facilities by 2020
- Gradual expansion of EHR



Way Forward

- Translate lessons into action
- Strengthen HEOC and overall structures
- Standard data/information sharing mechanism and tools, leveraging technology
- What if urban experiences a massive impact and rural health remains intact?
- Evidence based preparedness and response.





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Sonit Awal, just five months old at the time, had been buried in the rubble of his collapsed home in Muldhoka, Bhaktapur following the April 2015 earthquake, and was rescued 22 hours later.
