- Programme duration: July 2015 - March 2017
- Working districts:
 - **NHSSP**: 3 focal districts (Ramechhap, Dolakha and Sindhupalchowk)
 - **Handicap International**: Dolakha, Sindhupalchowk, Rasuwa and Nuwakot
 - **Spinal Injury Rehabilitation Center**: Dolakha, Sindhupalchowk, Rasuwa and Nuwakot
 - **Transcultural Psychosocial Organisation**: Ramechhap, Dolakha, Nuwakot, Kavre

Programme Overview cont....

- **Essential Health Care Services:** Maternal Neonatal and Child Health (MNCH) and Family Planning (FP)
- **Public Financial Management:** Transaction Accounting and Budget Control System (TABUCS) implementation support
- **Monitoring & Evaluation:** Health Management Information System (HMIS) support and start up of e-reporting in focal districts
- **Rehab and Psychosocial:** 3 NGO partners (HI, SIRC, TPO)
- **Gender Equality & Social Inclusion (GESI)** including equity monitoring
- **Infrastructure** support

1. Provide post-EQ support in two focal districts:

- Dolakha
- Ramechhap
- Sindhupalchowk was added later

2. Continue Health System Strengthening support at national level
