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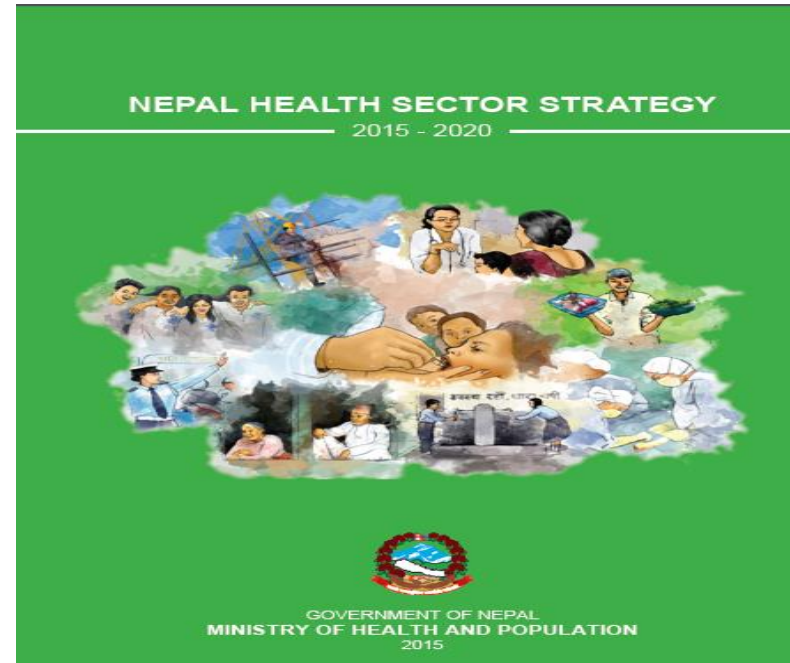
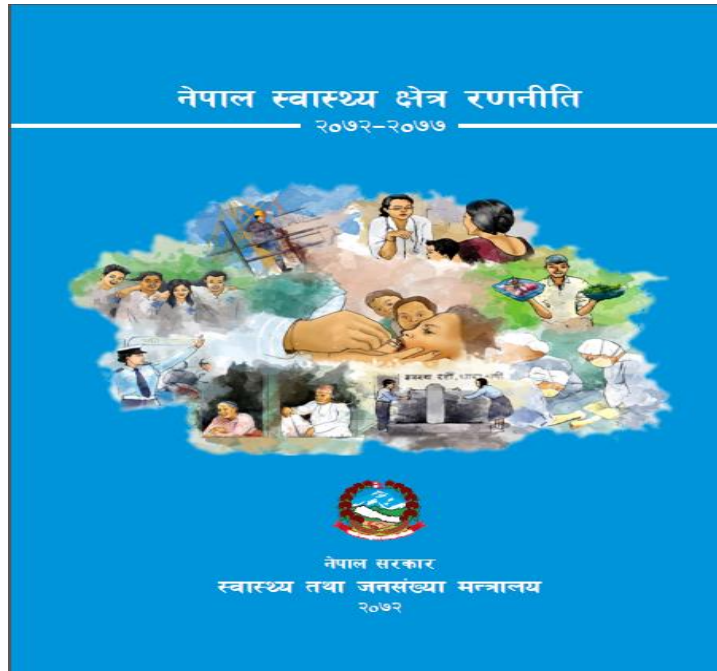

Vision

All Nepali citizens have productive and quality lives with highest level of physical, mental, social and emotional health.

Mission

Ensure citizens' fundamental rights to stay healthy by utilizing available resources optimally and through strategic cooperation between service providers, service users and other stakeholders.

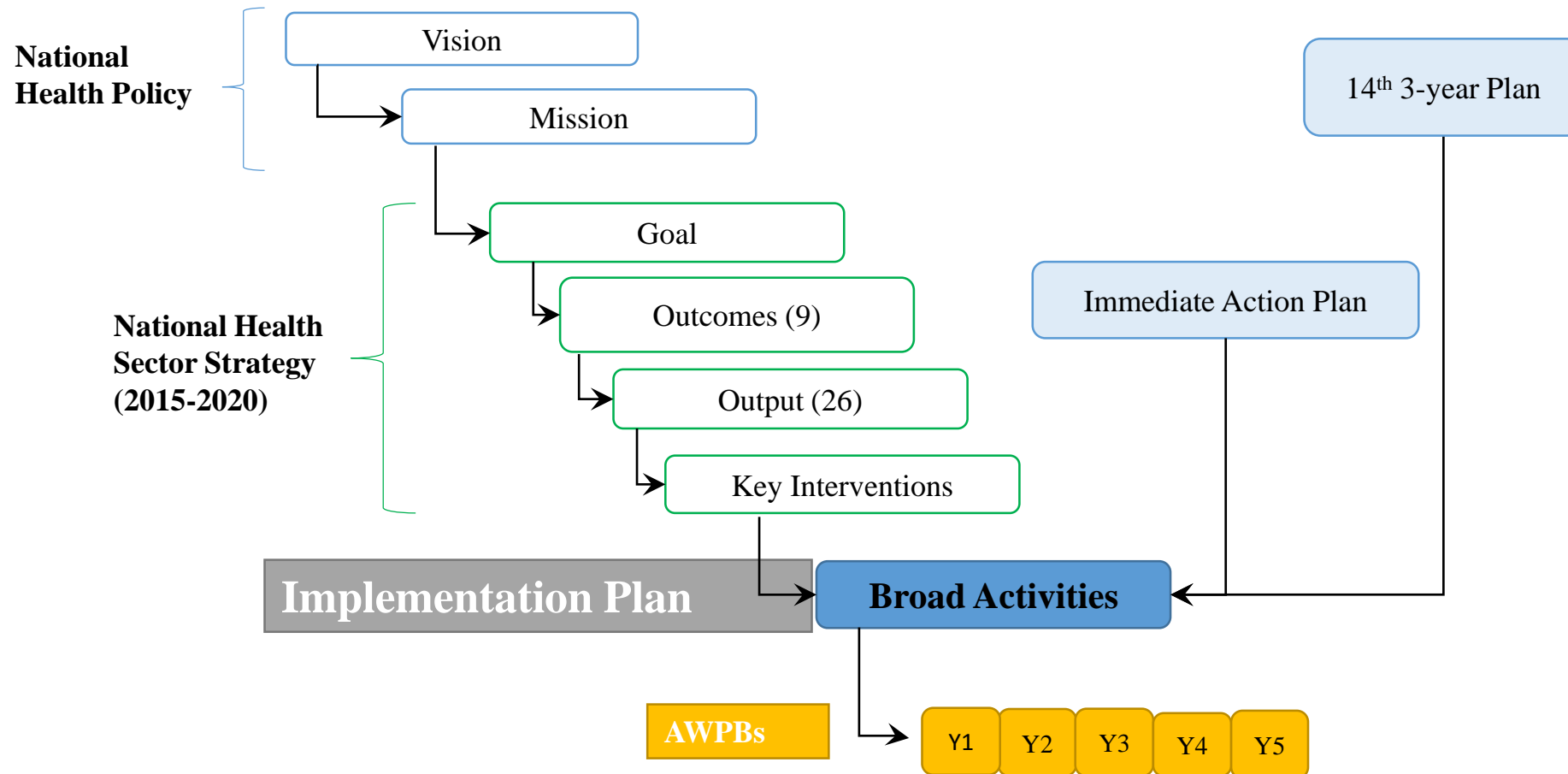

- Outcome 4** Strengthened **decentralised planning** and budgeting
- Outcome 5** Improved **sector management** and **governance**
- Outcome 6** Improved sustainability of **health sector financing**
- Outcome 7** Improved **healthy lifestyles** and **environment**
- Outcome 8** Strengthened management of **public health emergencies**
- Outcome 9** Improved availability and **use of evidence** in decision-making processes at all levels

NHSS IP - Development process

Structure

- Steering committee – chaired by secretary, MoH
- Technical team – coordinated by chief, PPICD, MoH
- Core task team

Process

- Template prepared and shared to all program departments/ divisions/ centers
- Actual working group at divisions/centers comprising of relevant development partners drafted the IP
- Core task team compiled and finalized
- Round of meetings, email communication and face to face meetings for draft finalization
- Final meeting held at MoH on 28 December 2016, chaired by hon. Minister

Key Features of NHSS IP

Progressive translation of the **vision and mission** of National Health Policy 2071 (2014) to guide the health sector for next five years

Provides the basis for Nepal to move towards **Universal Health Coverage** through four key strategic directions or approaches

Implements **Basic Health Service** package

Elaborates **monitoring** of sector performance under NHSS

Provides guidance for **AWPB from 2016/17 to 2020/21**

PPICD	Quality of Care	Autonomous agency for quality control, accreditation and licensing of health institutions
NHEICC	Health Promotion	Establish national health promotion bureau/division from centre, provincial and local levels
LMD	Procurement	Elevated LMD with increased capacity for procurement with new specialised cadre
LCD	Leprosy and Disability	Elevate Leprosy Control Division to Leprosy Control and Disability Management & Rehabilitation Division (DMRD)
PPICD	Planning	Restructure PPICD with specific focus on Policy, Planning and International Cooperation
